**INSTALLATION AT THE POINT OF CONNECTION**

**Application – All Customers**

**'X'- Majority of Rules and Regulations has changed**

- A. The consumer will cause to be installed by a New Mexico licensed electrician the meter loop, where applicable, using a meter base supplied by the Cooperative. Upon the Cooperative's receipt of a permit from the licensed electrician and approval from the New Mexico Constructors Industry Division inspector, the Cooperative shall install the metering device and provide service. The meter loop shall remain the property of the consumer, shall be subject to any applicable New Mexico statutes, codes or regulations and shall be the point of transfer of ownership of delivered capacity and energy. Should at any time the Cooperative determine the consumer's meter loop is unsafe or hazardous to the consumer or the general public, the Cooperative may discontinue service until such time corrective measures have been placed into effect by a New Mexico licensed electrician, subject to any New Mexico permitting requirements, and the condition resolved. The Cooperative will provide all other protective equipment as required for the protection of the Cooperative. The consumer will be responsible for the installing and maintaining the necessary protective devices for the consumer's equipment on the consumer's side of the meter.
  - B. All meters will be installed on meter pole furnished by the Cooperative, unless authorization is obtained from Cooperative in advance.
  - C. All service connections, repairs and replacements from or to the Cooperative's system are to be made by Cooperative authorized personnel only and under the supervision of the Cooperative.
  - D. The consumer agrees, in accepting service, that no one except the employees of the Cooperative shall be allowed to make internal or external adjustments of any meter or any other piece of apparatus which is the property of the Cooperative.
  - E. In the event a consumer requests a primary metering point, all facilities on the load side of the primary metering point supplied by the Cooperative shall be constructed and permitted by a New Mexico licensed contractor, at the sole expense of the consumer, and shall be the sole property of the consumer. Upon receipt of the

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permit from the New Mexico licensed contractor and approval from the New Mexico Constructors Industry Division, the Cooperative shall install the metering devices and provide electrical service. The Cooperative assumes no liability for any facilities beyond the Cooperative's primary metering point.

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
