## Electrical Safety Tips for Hunters

Central Valley Electric Cooperative encourages all members to be aware of electrical equipment while hunting. Keep these safety tips in mind as you enjoy the great outdoors.

- **Keep clear of electrical equipment.**
- **Do NOT shoot at or near power lines or insulators.**
- **Scope out the area and know where power lines and equipment are located where you hunt.**
- **Be vigilant in wooded areas where power lines may not be as visible.**
- **Never place deer stands on utility poles.**
- **Never place decoys on power lines or other utility equipment.**



## CVE Hosted State Legislative Committee

On September 16, Central Valley Electric Cooperative hosted the State Economic Development and Policy Committee in the Jack Case Community Room.

The committee, made up of State Senator's and Representative's, heard several presentations about CVE, Artesia, Artesia Public Schools, and Eddy County. Al Davis, Eddy County Manager gave the committee an overview of the county's industries and how they contribute to the state budget. CVE General Manager, Chuck Pinson told the committee about the co-op, and that CVE is the largest cooperative in the state in terms of Net Utility Plant. He also expressed the shared concerns of electric cooperatives across the state with regard to future grid reliability and how that could effect economic development in the state.

CVE is always happy to host legislative committee meetings, and we work hard to keep good working relationships with our elected officials.
